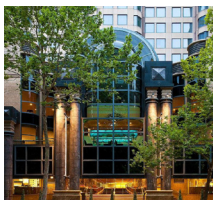
Conference dinner — Thursday 17 October 2019

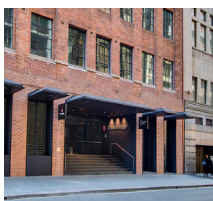
